A BILL

To enhance transparency for certain surveillance programs authorized by the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Surveillance Trans-
- 5 parency Act of 2013".
- 6 SEC. 2. ENHANCED PUBLIC REPORTING FOR ORDERS
- 7 UNDER THE FOREIGN INTELLIGENCE SUR-
- 8 VEILLANCE ACT OF 1978.
- 9 (a) Enhanced Reporting for Electronic Sur-
- 10 VEILLANCE ORDERS.—Section 107 of the Foreign Intel-

1	ligence Surveillance Act of 1978 (50 U.S.C. 1807) is
2	amended—
3	(1) by redesignating subsections (a) and (b) as
4	paragraphs (1) and (2), respectively;
5	(2) in paragraph (1), as redesignated by para-
6	graph (1) of this subsection, by striking "and" at
7	the end;
8	(3) in paragraph (2), as redesignated by para-
9	graph (1) of this subsection, by striking the period
10	at the end and inserting a semicolon; and
11	(4) by adding at the end the following:
12	"(3) the total number of individuals who were
13	subject to electronic surveillance conducted under an
14	order entered under this title, provided that if this
15	number is fewer than 500, it shall exclusively be ex-
16	pressed as a numerical range of 'fewer than 500'
17	and shall not be expressed as an individual number;
18	and
19	"(4) the total number of citizens of the United
20	States and aliens lawfully admitted for permanent
21	residence (as defined in section 101(a)(20) of the
22	Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
23	1101(a)(20)) who were subject to electronic surveil-
24	lance conducted under an order entered under this
25	title, provided that if this number is fewer than 500,

1	it shall exclusively be expressed as a numerical range
2	of 'fewer than 500' and shall not be expressed as an
3	individual number.".
4	(b) Enhanced Reporting for Pen Registers
5	AND TRAP AND TRACE DEVICES.—Section 406 of the
6	Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 (50 U.S.C.
7	1846) is amended by adding at the end the following:
8	"(c)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), in April
9	of each year, the Attorney General shall submit to Con-
10	gress a report setting forth with respect to the preceding
11	year—
12	"(A) the total number of applications made for
13	orders approving the use of a pen register and trap
14	and trace devices under this title;
15	"(B) the total number of such orders either
16	granted, modified, or denied;
17	"(C) a good faith estimate of the total number
18	of individual persons whose electronic or wire com-
19	munications information was obtained through the
20	use of pen register or trap and trace devices author-
21	ized under an order entered under this title;
22	"(D) good faith estimates of the total numbers
23	of United States persons—
24	"(i) whose electronic or wire communica-
25	tions information was obtained through the use

1	of pen register or trap and trace devices author-
2	ized under an order entered under this title;
3	"(ii) whose electronic communications in-
4	formation was obtained through the use of pen
5	register or trap and trace devices authorized
6	under an order entered under this title, and the
7	number of such persons whose information was
8	subsequently reviewed or accessed by a Federal
9	officer, employee, or agent; and
10	"(iii) whose wire communications informa-
11	tion was obtained through the use of pen reg-
12	ister or trap and trace devices authorized under
13	an order entered under this title, and the num-
14	ber of such persons whose information was sub-
15	sequently reviewed or accessed by a Federal of-
16	ficer, employee, or agent; and
17	"(E) the total number of computer-assisted
18	search queries initiated by a Federal officer, em-
19	ployee, or agent in any database of electronic or wire
20	communications information obtained through the
21	use of a pen register or trap and trace device au-
22	thorized under an order entered under this title, and
23	the number of such queries whose search terms in-
24	cluded information from the electronic or wire com-
25	munications information of a United States person.

1	"(2) If an estimate specified in subparagraphs (C)
2	or (D) of paragraph (1) is fewer than 500, it shall exclu-
3	sively be expressed as a numerical range of 'fewer than
4	500' and shall not be expressed as an individual number.
5	"(3) Each report under this section shall be sub-
6	mitted in unclassified form and shall be made available
7	to the public 7 days after the date such report is submitted
8	to Congress.
9	"(4) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to
10	authorize or in any other way affect the lawfulness or un-
11	lawfulness of installing or using a pen register or trap and
12	trace device.
13	"(5) In this subsection:
14	"(A) The terms 'electronic communication' and
15	'wire communication' have the meanings given those
16	terms in section 2510 of title 18, United States
17	Code.
18	"(B) The term 'individual person' means any
19	individual and excludes any group, entity, associa-
20	tion, corporation, or governmental entity.
21	"(C) The term 'United States person' means a
22	citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully ad-
23	mitted for permanent residence (as defined in sec-
24	tion 101(a)(20) of the Immigration and Nationality
25	Act (8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(20)).".

1	(c) Enhanced Reporting for Business Records
2	REQUESTS.—Section 502 of the Foreign Intelligence Sur-
3	veillance Act of 1978 (50 U.S.C. 1862) is amended—

11	title 18, United States Code."; and
12	(2) by amending subsection (c) to read as fol-
13	lows:
14	"(c)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), in April

20	mitted in unclassified form and shall be made available
21	to the public 7 days after the date such report is submitted
22	to Congress.
23	"(4) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to
24	authorize or in any other way affect the lawfulness or un-
25	lawfulness of using an order for the production of tangible

content) were collected pursuant to a direc-
tive issued under section 702, and the
number of such persons whose communica-
tion records were subsequently reviewed or
accessed by a Federal officer, employee, or
agent; and
"(vi) who were subscribers or cus-
tomers of an electronic communication
service or remote computing service whose
records, as described in subparagraphs
(A), (B), (D), (E), and (F) of section
2703(c)(2) of title 18, United States Code,
were produced pursuant to a directive
issued under section 702, and the number
of such persons whose records were subse-

1	quently reviewed or accessed by a Federal
2	officer, employee, or agent.
3	"(2) Statement of numerical range.—It
4	an estimate specified in subparagraphs (B) or (C) of
5	paragraph (1) is fewer than 500, it shall exclusively
6	be expressed as a numerical range of 'fewer than
7	500' and shall not be expressed as an individual
8	number.
9	"(3) Public availability.—Each report
10	under this subsection shall be submitted in unclassi-
11	fied form and shall be made available to the public
12	7 days after the date such report is submitted to
13	Congress.
14	"(4) Definitions.—In this subsection:
15	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The terms 'contents'
16	'electronic communication', 'electronic commu-
17	nication service', and 'wire communication' have
18	the same meanings given those terms in section
19	2510 of title 18, United States Code.
20	"(B) Individual person.—The term in-
21	dividual person' means any individual and ex-
22	cludes any group, entity, association, corpora-
23	tion, or governmental entity.
24	"(C) REMOTE COMPUTING SERVICE.—The
25	term 'remote computing service' shall have the

1	same meaning given that term in section 2711
2	of title 18, United States Code.
3	"(D) UNITED STATES PERSON.—The term
4	'United States person' means a citizen of the
5	United States or an alien lawfully admitted for
6	permanent residence (as defined in section
7	101(a)(20) of the Immigration and Nationality
8	Act (8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(20)).
9	"(5) Construction.—Nothing in this section
10	shall be construed to authorize or in any other way
11	affect the lawfulness or unlawfulness of using an
12	order or directive under section 702, 703, or 704 to
13	collect any of the information described in subpara-
14	graph (B) or (C) of paragraph (1).".
15	SEC. 3. PUBLIC DISCLOSURES OF AGGREGATE INFORMA
16	TION RELATED TO ORDERS UNDER THE FOR
17	EIGN INTELLIGENCE SURVEILLANCE ACT OF

19	(a) DISCLOSURES.—The Foreign Intelligence Surveil-
20	lance Act of 1978 (50 U.S.C. 1801 et seq.) is amended
21	by adding at the end the following:

1	"TITLE IX—PUBLIC DISCLO-
2	SURES OF AGGREGATE IN-
3	FORMATION.
4	"SEC. 901. PUBLIC DISCLOSURES OF AGGREGATE INFOR-
5	MATION.
6	"(a) In General.—Except as provided under sub-
7	section (c), a person that has received an order under sec-
8	tion 105, 402, or 501, or an order or a directive under
9	section 702, 703, or 704 may, every six months with re-
10	spect to the preceding six month period, disclose to the
11	public information with respect to each statutory authority
12	as follows:
13	"(1) The total number of orders or directives
14	received under the authority.
15	"(2) The percentage or total number of such
16	orders or directives complied with, in whole or in
17	part.
18	"(3) The total number of individual persons,
19	users, or accounts whose information of any kind
20	was produced to the Government, or was obtained or
21	collected by the Government, under an order or di-
22	rective received under the authority.
23	"(b) Nature of Production.—Except as provided
24	under subsection (c), a person that has received an order
25	under section 402 or 501, or an order or a directive under

- 1 section 702 may, every six months with respect to the pre-
- 2 ceding six month period, disclose to the public the total
- 3 number of individual persons, users, or accounts for whom
- 4 the following information was produced to the Govern-
- 5 ment, or was obtained or collected by the Government,
- 6 with respect to each such authority, if applicable:
- 7 "(1) The contents of electronic communications.
- 8 "(2) The contents of wire communications.
- 9 "(3) Records concerning electronic communica-
- tions.
- 11 "(4) Records concerning wire communications.
- 12 "(5) Information described in subparagraph
- 13 (A), (B), (D), (E), or (F) of section 2703(c)(2) of
- 14 title 18.
- 15 "(c) STATEMENT OF NUMERICAL RANGE.—If the
- 16 total number of individual persons, users, or accounts
- 17 specified in paragraph (3) of subsection (a) or in para-
- 18 graphs (1), (2), (3), (4), or (5) of subsection (b) is fewer
- 19 than 500, it shall exclusively be expressed as a numerical
- 20 range of 'fewer than 500' and shall not be expressed as
- 21 an individual number.
- 22 "(d) Permitted Disclosure.—No cause of action
- 23 shall lie in any court against any person for making a dis-
- 24 closure in accordance with this section.

1	"(e) Construction.—Nothing in this section shall
2	be construed—
3	"(1) to authorize or in any other way affect the
4	lawfulness or unlawfulness of using an order or di-
5	rective described in subsection (a) to obtain, collect,
6	or secure the production of information described in

9	"(2) to prohibit, implicitly preclude, or in any
10	other way affect the lawfulness or unlawfulness of a
11	disclosure not authorized by this section.

20	ernmental entity.
21	"(3) Person.—The term 'person' has the
22	meaning given that term in section 101.".
